

Business Process Redesign

Agencies worked collaboratively to show all the tasks they complete in their current systems — and to share insights on how tasks could be done better in Luma.



Chart of Accounts Design

Agency personnel are designing their Chart of Accounts, which makes up the fundamental building blocks that organize financial and other data across the state.



Procurement Survey

Procurement operations in Luma are being designed based on the direction and feedback provided by agencies in Procurement Survey responses.



Budget Survey

Budget operations in Luma are being designed based on the direction and feedback provided by agencies in Procurement Survey responses.



Interface and Conversion Build-out

Many agencies have important, specialized systems used to help Idahoans. Agencies are helping to connect those systems, and the data in them, to work in tandem with Luma.



User Acceptance Testing

Only Agency expertise can determine if Luma is working correctly to accomplish their business. That's why key Agency personnel will be invited to test the system thoroughly starting in February 2021.

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Key Benefits of Luma



Single Sign On

- A fully integrated system improves productivity with single sign-on to access all modules within Luma.
- Dual authentication is an industry best practice that improves data security.

Statewide Chart of Accounts

- A statewide Chart of Accounts allows agencies to see apples to apples comparisons.
- With a standard Chart of Accounts, Luma will provide greater detailed information and context surrounding budget, finance, and procurement activities.



Strategic Sourcing

- The State increases its negotiation power by consolidating purchasing under Luma.
- Luma promotes strategic sourcing of goods and services, saving the State and citizens money.



Efficiency

- A fully integrated system transfers information from one functional area to another without manual effort.
- Integration eliminates dual entry of data, allowing employees to focus on critical work activities rather than repetitive data entry.



Auditability

- Within Luma, each transaction is recorded sequentially and indefinitely.
- Luma will eliminate the manual burden of preparing for audits.



Data Lake

- Luma will allow agencies to download raw and unstructured data into a data lake.
